In 1801, His Royal Highness Frederick, Duke of York, laid the cornerstone in Chelsea for what would later become the Duke of York's Royal Military School, an institution catering to the children of military personnel, officially opening its doors in 1803. By 1909, the School had relocated to its current location in Dover, Kent. In 2010, it achieved the distinction of being the first state full boarding academy, welcoming families from all backgrounds who sought its unique and distinguished approach to secondary education.

Despite its non-selective nature, the School consistently surpasses national averages in GCSE results. The hallmark of the institution lies in the remarkable progress students make during their tenure, facilitated by features such as supervised prep, small class sizes, and proactive support aimed at maximising each student's potential. The bustling and vibrant full boarding school model includes Saturday morning lessons, sport fixtures, captivating performances ranging from theatrical productions to musical concerts, and a variety of afternoon activities to enrich the students' experiences.

The overarching goal is to provide an all-round education with a strong pastoral emphasis, encapsulated in the motto "looking forward with confidence, looking back with pride." The extensive co-curricular program offers a plethora of opportunities, exposing students to diverse experiences and preparing them for success beyond their time at the School. # **Sports Scholarships**

Wholehearted pursuit of excellence in sports aims to instil a lifelong passion for athleticism and the values it encompasses. Students are provided ample opportunities to engage in competitive fixtures and benefit from extensive sports facilities, including a floodlit AstroTurf, Olympic-standard athletics track, indoor heated swimming pool, floodlit netball courts, tennis courts, sports hall, climbing walls, fitness centre, outdoor fitness trails, and squash courts.

Recipients of Sports Scholarships are expected to bring excellence and commitment to their chosen sport while actively contributing to the School community. Candidates are evaluated against the School's admission criteria and assessed based on their current performance and future potential, ensuring promising athletes have the chance to thrive and enrich our sporting community.

These Sports Scholarships may entail fee reductions, assistance with the purchase of sports kit and equipment, or a contribution towards travel expenses. Means testing is conducted before awarding these scholarships, and the level of support is determined by the Director of Sport based on the student's performance.

Sport Scholarship opportunities are available in Year 9, 10, and 12, and interested students should complete an application form, available on the School website. Additional support is provided in Rugby and Hockey through the School's performance player pathways with Ealing Trailfinders and the White Rose Academy.

While the School's major sports are listed below, athletes from other disciplines are encouraged to apply and will be considered for scholarship opportunities.

### **Rugby Scholarship**

#### with Ealing Trailfinders Rugby Academy



Our collaboration with Ealing Trailfinders Rugby Club provides a well-defined pathway for aspiring professional rugby players, beginning at the age of 13 and extending to the Ealing first team. Along this journey, players receive exceptional training, access to excellent facilities, and a high-quality academic education, initially at the Duke of York's Royal Military School and later at Brunel University.

Candidates must meet the School's admission criteria and will be evaluated based on their current performance and future potential. These Rugby Scholarships may include fee reductions, assistance with the purchase of sports kit and equipment, or a contribution towards travel expenses. Rugby Scholarships undergo means testing before being granted, with the level of support also determined by the student's performance, overseen by the Head of Rugby.

The Trailfinders Rugby Academy offers a comprehensive array of training sessions, visits, fitness programs, and competitions for its Scholars, including:

- · Year-round coaching sessions.
- · Assistance in accessing external training opportunities.
- Link with the Ealing Trailfinders Pathway leading to Brunel University.
- Domestic and international visits and tours.
- Sport science support encompassing video analysis, strength and conditioning programs, and medical assistance.
- Access to the Ealing Trailfinders Elite Player Pathway for Under-16 to Under-18 age groups, held at the School.
- Participation in competitive internal and external matches.
- The chance to represent the Ealing Trailfinders Under-18 Team.
