WHAT WE OFFER OUR SCHOLARS

Hockey scholarships (supported by the White Rose Academy) are awarded to those who bring excellence and dedication to DOYRMS sport and make a full contribution to the School community.

Candidates must meet the School's entry requirements and will be assessed against the evidence of their current performance and future potential.

As part of this bespoke scholarship, fee remission stands at 50%, with entry into the programme in Years 9, 10 & 12 (Sixth Form).

Scholars will benefit from:

- An all-round full boarding education at 50% reduction in fees.
- Support throughout the hockey player pathway (transport to Development Centre for training and financial contribution for candidates who move onto County representation).
- £200 voucher to use with a School's sports-wear provider, the Gilbert, Grays and Gray Nicolls Group.
