REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives of the charity are as follows:-

- To provide items, services, grants and facilities (including land and buildings of any kind or tenure) for the Duke of York's Royal Military School.
- To promote the education of students and former students of the School who are in need of financial assistance.
- To advance the education of students attending the School by the award of prizes (or other suitable rewards or marks of distinction).
- Such other charitable purposes as the trustees shall from time to time think fit.

The main activities undertaken during the year were the provision of items, services, facilities and opportunities for the Duke of York's Royal Military School and pupils of the School.

The trustees of the charity have had due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit. The charity's objectives and aims have been reviewed taking this guidance into account.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The Dukies' Foundation is the tied charity of the Duke of York's Royal Military School which opened in 1803 by royal decree under the leadership of HRH Prince Frederick, Duke of York when Commander in Chief of the British Army. He wanted to look after the children of ordinary soldiers, boys and girls (readmitted in 1994) many of whose fathers fell in the Napoleonic Wars - Dukies aged 14-22 fought at Waterloo in 1815. The mission continues to this day - Dukie parents have served in all the conflicts of modern times - with 50% of pupil roll coming from service families.

A decade ago the Foundation was reorganised, drawing in funds from redundant military and other charities. A policy of larger distribution was adopted; since 2011 £370,000 has been invested into 'helping the Dukies of today.' The most striking statistic this year? Income received (£103,039) in the year increased by 104% due in the main to the increasing contribution from old Dukies. Recognised within The Clocktower Society, Dukie donors grew by half again to 105.

Expenditure was £113,608. Despite this, net funds held at year end increased to £400,644 (2018 - £396,198). Advisor Quilter Cheviot has materially aided investment performance over time. Channels of expenditure included £27,000 to student support (11 bursary awards made so far) where the Foundation has identified a key transition point, Year 11 to 12-13, 5th into 6th Form, of military family children affected by the restrictions on MoD Continuity of Education Allowance. The White Rose Academy, a dual gender hockey and personal development initiative received £17,003. Leadership continued its extra-curricular, adventurous activities, a fund is held for the maintenance of the Dukie Memorial at the National Arboretum; and the iconic War Memorial was restored in an iconic centenary year. All these channels were old Dukie-funded.

Grants from Unrestricted Funds amounted to £61,180. We pay for the Alumni Relations & Development Officer function which has driven the growth of alumni relations in the life of the School, investing time and expertise as well as funds. We also made grants to additional amenities and activities - among others, state of the art audio-visual equipment, photographic equipment, a scientific visit to the CERN institute, Geneva and a unique marking of the WW1 Centenary which partnered London conservatoire musicians with pupils in music, drama and dance.

We were notified of our first major legacy from the estate of Peter Goble (School 1947-53) which will be reported in next year's accounts - we are working on a broader legacy campaign. Vital progress on our Archive is in hand with the Army Museum Ogilby Trust and we hope to develop further, deeper relationships with external grant-making bodies; some already make significant bursary grants direct to School. We want to expand the effort here.

We are gratified to see the School family's upward march in terms of academic results, Ofsted rating and, as importantly, the all-round experience offered to the Dukies of today. The Dukies' Foundation has its part to play in this, a part we seek to maintain and grow.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Total funds held at 31 August 2019 amount to £400,644 (2018 - £396,198) of which £64,366 (£61,787) is restricted and not available for the general purpose of the charity and £336,278 (£334,411) is unrestricted.

The charity's reserves policy is not to pay out any grants or scholarships that would leave the funds in deficit. The charity has very low running costs and, therefore, the trustees do not consider it necessary to set a minimum reserves figure.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is governed by a Charity Commission scheme sealed 5 March 2009 under which the following previous charities were consolidated:-

The Coventry Tupper Trust
The Amenities Fund
28th Divisional Scholarship Fund
6th Division War Memorial Scholarship
Society of St Georges Fund
Prizes, Games and Sports Fund
Old Boy's War Memorial Scholarship Fund
1st East Anglian Regiment (Royal Norfolk and Suffolk Fund)

There should be not less than seven trustees including the principal and chair of governors of the School. The chair of governors of the School should not also be the chair of the trustees.

Each appointment must be made for a period not exceeding five years. The principal and chair of governors of the School should be ex-officio trustees and, therefore, not subject to any time limit in their appointments.

In addition to the chair of governors and the principal, no more than two School governors should be trustees and there must not be more than 50% of trustees that are also governors of the School.

The current Trustees have a strong network of contacts from the educational, fundraising, not-for-profit sector and the Alumni of the School to provide the necessary skills and expertise.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

The Dukies' Foundation is a public benefit entity registered as an unincorporated charity in England. The charity's registered number, principal address and nature of operations can be found within the Reference and Administrative Details page and the Report of Trustees.

The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

• the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
