Welcome to the first Careers newsletter of 2022. Here you will some good links to apprenticeship options, details of university open days, both in person and virtual, and details of the School's ongoing careers programmes.

Important information for parents of Year 11 students

- The requirements for students to enter 6th Form (Year 12) here at The Duke of York's Royal Military School are: four GCSE grades at 6, and a further two at 5, these are to include English and Mathematics. Most subjects to be taken at A level would require a 6 at GCSE, (7 for sciences or Maths). Subjects offered at A level which are not taught at GCSE have equivalent requirements for instance, to take Psychology at A level would require a 6 in both English and Maths. Year 11 progress reports and predicted grades are currently being released: if these do not meet the above requirements to enter 6th form, we recommend that parents should now be looking for alternative provisions.
- Sixth Form academic scholarships with an 80% reduction in fees may be offered to students who achieve a minimum of three grade 8 & three grade 7 GCSE results. Sports scholarships may also be available. For further details, please contact the Admissions Department.

Option choices for Year 9 & Year 11 students



If considering university after Year 13, open days are a good way of getting a feel for surroundings and courses. Students should be looking to undertake at least two visits, either virtually or in person, before commencing the UCAS application process during the autumn term of Year 13.

Whatever subject students may be considering at university, or even if applying for a



higher level or degree apprenticeship or other work-based learning, it is vitally important to be able to demonstrate thorough background knowledge, and a passion for a particular area of study. In the library, I am currently compiling a 'Read Around Your Subject' reading list, with plenty of titles available to give students that extra edge whilst writing their UCAS personal statements. This should be released before half

term and will be posted on the careers section of the School website.

Post – 18 opportunities

 Fancy working for MI5, MI6 or GCHQ, the government's security and surveillance services? British citizens who have grade 4 or above in English Language and Maths, and are expected to have earned at least 72 UCAS points (the equivalent of 3 'D'



grades at A level) by September 2022, are invited to apply for **software engineering** apprenticeships based in either London or Manchester. You will, of course, have an interest in programming and technology, but do not necessarily need to have

studied IT or Computing at A level. The starting salary is currently £24,385 pa if based in London (£22,889 in Manchester), and you would be working towards a BSc Honours Degree in Digital and Technology Solutions – with no student loan to pay back. 


• The government has just announced a new degree-level apprenticeship in **Economics** – the first of its kind. The Government Economic Service Degree Apprenticeship is a
